Competition participants and an excerpt from the Rules

10th European Deaf Orienteering Championships (EDOC)

- 1. All athletes representing their country must hold a valid passport from the country of their National Deaf Sport Federation (member EDSO).
- 2. Age Eligibility.
- 2.1. All orienteering athletes must be at least twenty-one (21) years old in the same year as the Competition.
- **2.2.** Orienteering athletes aged between 16 (sixteen) and 20 (twenty) years old can take part in the adults competitions.
- 3. Number of Athletes

Each National Federation may enter a maximum number of twelve (12) competitors – six (6) men and six (6) women.

- Sprint and Short distance- each nation may enter three (3) women and three (3) men.
- Sprint Relay each nation may enter one (1) team (two (2) women + two (2) men). Incomplete teams and teams with runners from more than one nation are not allowed.

4th European Deaf Junior Orienteering Championships (EDJOC)

- **1.1.** All juniors-athletes representing their country must hold a valid passport or a document from the country of their National Deaf Sport Federation (member EDSO).
- 2.1. Age Eligibility.
- **2.1.** All orienteering athletes must reach the age of twenty (20) years old in the same year as the Competition. (Example: Competition in 2024 the athletes must be born in 2004 or after).
- **2.2.** Any participants who is a minors (age of 18 and under) is required to submit the Underage Athlete Form with parents' and/or guardians' signature to EDSO in order to participate in the competition.
- 3. Number of Athletes

Each National Federation may enter a maximum number of twelve (12) competitors – six (6) men and six (6) women.

- Sprint and Short distance- each nation may enter three (3) women and three (3) men.
- Sprint Relay each nation may enter one (1) team (one (1) women + one (1) men).

2nd Open Deaf Masters Orienteering World Cup (ODMOWC)

- 1.1. All athletes (for the countries of Asia, Africa and America) representing their country must hold a valid passport from the country of their National Deaf Sport Federation (member ICSD)
- 1.2. All athletes representing their **European clubs** must have permission to participate from their National Deaf Sports Federation (EDSO member).
- 2.1. Age Eligibility.

M21-50, **W21-50**: regardless of the year of birth for the countries of Asia, Africa and America; born 1974-1983 for the European clubs

M51-60, **W51-60**: born 1964-1973


M61-70, **W61-70**: born 1963 and before

For a fairer "fair play" in each age group, a handicap system will be used to equalize between younger and older athletes in the same groups.

- **3.1.** There is no limit for each country and club to participate in the Open
- **3.2.** Sprint Relay Mix (1 Women+1 Men) & Sprint Relay Men (1 Men+1 Men) Free composition of the team regardless of countries and clubs.

VENUES AND EMBARGOED AREAS INFORMATION


The competition will take place in the Riga and it's surrondings.



According to the IOF Competition rules (§ 26.5), embargoed areas are forbidden for all potential EDOC, EDJOC, ODMOWC 2023 athletes, team officials and other persons, who, through knowledge of the terrain, may influence the results of the competitions. Considerable amount of open areas. Maximum height difference – 10 m.

Area first mapped 2017, renewed - 2022 - 2023

Terrain: Living district with different Soviet time and modern times arhictecture.

Maximum height difference – 10 m.

*Opportunities for training:

The organizers are studying the possibility of holding a training camp and participating in the city sprint competition in March or April 2024. More information later.

*Model: Sprint model (6th June) will be available. The sprint model will be held in Dzirciems R map south side. The starta and finish will be located in Latvian Association of the Deaf (Elvīras iela 19, Rīga).

Punching system

SPORTIdent AIR+ punching system will be used.
SIAC cards can be rented for 5 EURO/day (for all days)

Weather and climate

With an average high of 20°C and a low of 11°C) it generally feels mildly cool with a gentle breeze.

Clothing

Road running or light trail shoes recommended for sprint distances. Spiked shoes are allowed.

Event centre

Hotel "Mercure Riga Centre" (Elizabetes iela 101).

Team accreditation and team officials meeting will be held at the Event Centre.

Entries

Preliminary entry - until 30th of November 2023 Final entry - until 5th of February 2024 Name registration - until 5th of May 2024 Hotel reservation form - until 30th of April 2024 Arrival and departure form - until 5th of May 2024

Entry fees and payment

Latvian Deaf Sports Federation will offer the accommodation for all participants in Hotel

Cheaper options can be chosen independently in other hotels and hostels in the city of Riga. But it is usually difficult to book cheap seats in the city center there during such a period.

At your request, the Organisers can investigate the possibility of accommodation with your own sleeping bag or mat on the floor in the gym of the Ishkile school. There is a toilet and shower there. The estimated price is 5 euros per day per person.

Accreditation

Official accreditation will be on 06 June from 15.00 to 19.00 o'clock and on 07 June from 9.00 to 12.00 o'clock at the event center.

Competition rules

Competitions will be conducted in accordance with the technical regulation of EDOC 2023 and valid competition rules of International orienteering federation (IOF).

Anti-doping

All participants will follow valid WADA (World Anti-Doping Agency) regulations, ICSD (International Committee of Sport for the Deaf) Anti-Doping regulations and the International Orienteering Federation Anti-Doping Rules.

Health services

The Event Organizer will coordinate healthcare service for participants and will provide first-aid at each competition area. The Event Organizer will not bear any responsibility related to the cost of medical services of the participants. Each Federation is responsible for the health insurance of all their delegates.
